HELP for a CHILD

If a child is suspected of having a learning disability, the state Dept. of Education (DOE) can do an evaluation at no cost to the parent. Contact the Student Services' Coordinator (SSC) at the school the child attends. If the child is homeschooled or attends a private school, contact the SSC at their "home school" (the school the child would attend if they went to public school). Ask for Form 101: Request for Evaluation (For Educational and Related Services from Age 3 to 20).

HELP for an ADULT

If an adult is not employed due to a disability (and this may be due to dyslexia), contact the state Vocational Rehabilitation (VR) office at 586-5167 regarding services that they may be able to provide.
